

Guidelines on the Establishment of Health Committee at I-Shou University

Adopted on April 25, 1995, by the University Administration Council in the second semester of the academic year 1994

- I. The Guidelines on the Establishment of Health Committee at I-Shou University (hereinafter referred to as “the Guidelines”) are established by I-Shou University (hereinafter referred to as “the University”) pursuant to Article 5 of the School Health Act for the purpose of implementing health policies and initiatives and promoting the health and well-being of faculty members, staff, and students of the University. Accordingly, the Health Committee (hereinafter referred to as “the Committee”) is established.
- II. The Committee shall consist of one chairperson, one executive secretary, and eleven ex officio members. All committee members shall be appointed by the President and shall serve a one-academic-year term.

The chairperson shall be the Dean of Student Affairs, and the executive secretary shall be the Chief of the Health Section.

The ex officio members shall include the Secretary-General, the Dean of Human Resources, the Dean of Accounting, the Center Director of General Education, the Chief of the Student

Campus Life Guidance Section, the Chief of the Counseling and Guidance Section, the Chief of the Student Activity Section, the Chief of the General Affairs Section of the Office of General Affairs, one health expert, one student representative, and one representative of the local health authority.

III. The Committee shall be responsible for:

1. Reviewing and overseeing the University's annual health promotion plans;
2. Providing health care services;
3. Promoting health education and health counseling services;
4. Supervising and providing suggestions on environmental health throughout the University;
5. Supervising and managing campus food services and food hygiene; and
6. Handling other matters related to health promotion and health care services.

IV. The Committee shall meet at least once each semester, and ad hoc meetings may be convened as necessary.

V. All resolutions adopted by the Committee shall be submitted to the President for ratification and shall thereafter be forwarded to the responsible units for implementation.

VI. The Guidelines become effective on the third day of promulgation after being adopted by the University Administration Council and ratified by the President.

Note: In case of any disputes or misunderstandings regarding the interpretation of the language or terms of the Guidelines, the Chinese language version shall prevail.
